## Bruce Morrow Rockin' the Radio

● Sonorous-voiced Bruce Morrow—better known as “Cousin Brucie”—ruled New York City AM radio throughout the '60s, and now he's sharing his passion for classic rock with a new generation on SiriusXM Satellite Radio. “When I'm on air and a teenager calls requesting a '60s song, it proves

that the music we grew up on is so powerful it carries over for decades,” says Morrow. In his newest book, *Rock & Roll...And the Beat Goes On*, the legendary DJ recalls introducing—along with Ed Sullivan—the Beatles to 55,000 screaming fans at their first U.S. concert, at Shea Stadium. Lest you think Morrow, 75, is living in the past, his favorite musicians today are the Black Eyed Peas. And not long ago, he suggested to Paul McCartney that he change the lyric of his iconic “When I'm 64” to “When I'm 94.” At which time Morrow, no doubt, will still be rockin' the airwaves. —Jeanne McDowell
