**2** John Bryne Cook took a job as road manager

for Janis Joplin just three years before her death, at 27, in 1970. He gives his unique perspective on the short life of rock ‘n’ roll’s proto wild child in **On the Road With Janis Joplin** (\$26.95; Berkley Hardcover).

**3** The iconic ‘60s folk trio behind “If I Had a Hammer” and “Puff, The Magic Dragon” is spotlighted in Peter Yarrow and Noel Paul Stookey’s photo-packed memoir, **Peter, Paul and Mary: Fifty Years**

**in Music and Life** (\$24.95; Imagine/Charlesbridge).

**4** Neil Young’s **Special Deluxe** (\$32; Blue Rider) is projected through a unique prism: his love of old cars, complete with original drawings.

**5** Mick Fleetwood’s candid autobiography, **Play On** (\$30; Little, Brown & Co.), details his ups and downs as the sole constant in the ever-changing lineup of the legendary group Fleetwood Mac.
